Spring Is Here!



Lesson 28: Chickens

This spring we we focused several weeks on chickens including hatching chicks in an incubator. Since then, we have sold 6 laying Hens, 1 little rooster, 16 baby chicks, and 30 hatching eggs. We have raised \$323 to add to our class funds. These funds help our class be able to afford improvements to our class garden and provide feed for our chickens. We are currently sold out of chickens but can still provide hatching eggs. Our current chicken totals: 1 Rooster, 7 Hens (+4 Hens coming soon, see below)

We are currently still working on our deluxe chicken cooperand painting the run.
