Terms and Conditions

The terms of this policy apply to all hardware, software, and network services owned and operated by Champion Academy as well as those services used in conjunction with our own.

Expectations For Use

The iPad is not provided for personal entertainment. For example, it should not be used to watch movies or play games. Its primary purpose is for learning. The iPad is provided for these activities:

- Schoology
- Textbooks
- Research
- Assignment completion
- Participation in class
- Listening to music while studying and with teacher permission using headphones.

While using your electronic devices please remember to:

- Respect yourself and others
- Educate yourself and responsibly connect with others
- Protect yourself and others

Plagiarism & Pirating

Users must acknowledge the use of the intellectual property of others. Users must treat information found electronically in the same way as information found in printed sources. Rules against plagiarism will be enforced. Information obtained from the Internet as part of a research project must be attributed to its source, using a standard bibliography notation. Students and staff may not violate a copyrighted source, or otherwise use another person's intellectual property without his or her prior approval or proper citation. Please see the full plagiarism policy in the Champion Academy handbook.

Taking Good Care of the iPad

Don't take the iPad to bed with you; instead, put it on your desk and plug it in overnight with the school supplied charger. The iPad should not be taken to work, the rec center, mall, mission trips, soccer field, or any other place it is likely to get lost or stolen. iPads should not be taken off of campus unless it is during a tour. The iPad should never be left in the hall or in the cubbies by the entrance to the cafeteria unattended. The iPad should always be in the case provided by the school. If another iPad case is desired it needs to be pre-approved. Any damage or loss incurred to the iPad or any other computer equipment in your possession will be your responsibility. School installed apps may not be deleted in order to gain space unless with permission from the director of technology. Delete pictures instead.

Privileges

The use of your Champion iPad or network account is a privilege, not a right. By following Champion's guidelines for iPad and technology use, you will retain your privilege. The contents on your iPad and account, and the messages you send, receive, and store are not private. Champion can override all passwords.

Consequences

Your iPad and account will be monitored continually. If you use your iPad or account inappropriately, you will be held accountable through the following steps.

First infraction – the student loses internet privileges (or limited to a whitelist) for a time determined by AdCo.

Second infraction – in addition to step 1 consequences, the student meets with AdCo and must attend a DF & I study hall in order to watch a series of videos on responsible technology use (or attend classes on proper use of technology). Written summary and reflection required.

Third infraction – in additional to step 1 and 2 consequences, the student serves an in-house suspension. Student will attend classes but spend non-class time under staff supervision.

Security

Do not allow anyone else to use your account and do not use another individual's account. Do not reveal personal information – your address or telephone number, or those of students or colleagues. Do not contact strangers, who could potentially threaten your health or safety.

Summary

This is a list of the more common things students are specifically NOT permitted to do.

1. Download any files, especially music and videos, from the Internet, unless the material is free for commercial use and royalty free.
2. Download, access, upload, or distribute offensive or dangerous material.
3. Install any applications or software onto Campion Academy computers without permission.
4. Disable or modify any running tasks or services.
5. Transfer and/or store music files from any personal devices to Campion Academy systems without permission.
6. Play games, unless directed to by an instructor or supervisor for educational purposes, at any time on Campion Academy computers, including Internet-based games.
7. Use proxies or other means to bypass the content filtering systems in place and or defeat any settings that prevent the access of material deemed and flagged as inappropriate by the blocking devices.
8. Use remote accessing software or hardware to take control of any network attached device or workstation.
9. Disrupt its use by other individuals by connecting to other networks to perform any illegal or inappropriate act, such as an attempt to gain unauthorized access to other systems on the network.
10. Disregard copyrights and licenses, as well as the legal rights of the software producers any network providers.
11. Use another person's user account or access their credentials.
12. Attempt to log onto the network as a system administrator.
13. Harass, intimidate, or bully others. Foul, abusive, discriminatory, or demeaning language and obscene images or texts are forms of harassment.
