OVERVIEW

Campion Academy is committed to staying open for in-person classes for the 2021-2022 school year. We are also committed to providing an environment which keeps students and staff as safe and healthy as possible. The following plan is based upon the recommendations of the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the Rocky Mountain Conference of Seventh-day Adventists.

Due to the decrease in transmission of COVID-19 in Colorado and the availability of vaccines, current recommendations allow for a return to normalcy in many areas. However, the increasing prevalence of the Delta and Omicron variants warrant maintaining the most essential safety precautions, such as wearing masks indoors.

As the situation changes regarding the pandemic, these policies will be updated to reflect current best practices.

CAMPUS ACCESS

Visitors are allowed on campus and must check in at the main office upon arrival.

Visitors are required to wear masks in all campus buildings, regardless of vaccination status. Face masks are not required outdoors.

Guest rooms in the residence halls are not available at this time.

The RV park is available for short-term stays.

AD BUILDING & CLASSROOMS

TEMPERATURE CHECKS & SCREENINGS

- Temperature checks and screenings will no longer be required, but students and staff are asked to self-assess and report any COVID-19 symptoms.
- Students should not attend class if they have any signs of illness.

FACE MASKS

- Face masks are required to be worn in all buildings on campus at all times, regardless of vaccination status, except in dorm rooms, following the CDC recommended wearing instructions which includes covering the mouth and nose.
- Students and staff will be responsible to have and wear their own personal face masks.
- Once students are seated in class and are spaced at least six-feet from the teacher or behind the safety shield, the teacher may remove his or her mask for instruction. Masks must be worn throughout classes by students and when a teacher approaches students to help them.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING IN THE CLASSROOM

- Students will have assigned seats in each classroom. Desks will be positioned to provide as much space as possible between each desk, three feet when possible.
- We are recommending students to maintain at least three-feet of physical distance from others whenever possible to avoid potentially being a close-contact in the event of a positive case.

CHURCH & CHAPELS

- Chapel and Sabbath School will be held in the student chapel in Hankins Hall.
- In the Campion Church, students will sit in a designated section of the church.
- Face masks are required during chapels and church services.

EXTRACURRICULAR

ATHLETICS

- Champion is pursuing reinstating the interscholastic varsity sports program. Champion will follow the COVID guidelines given to us by CHSAA.
- We plan to start the school year with Women's Volleyball and Men's Soccer teams.
- Face masks are required in the gymnasium.



MUSIC

- All music classes and performance groups have been reinstated including, choir (up to 30 people), Koinonia, bells, and orchestra.
- Music performance masks will be used in all ensembles.



STUDENT LIFE

AND NON-CLASSROOM AREAS

CAFETERIA

- Tables will be placed in the cafeteria with limited seating at each table to comply with physical distancing and safety regulations.
- Masks must be worn unless seated and eating.
- All cafeteria workers are required to wear a face mask at all times.
- A salad bar will once again be available. Students are expected to use hand sanitizer before and after using self-service stations.
- Tables and chairs will be disinfected between use.



TRANSPORTATION

- Face masks must be worn while in any school vehicle according to federal public transportation requirements.
- We are no longer requiring reduced capacity in school vehicles.
- Campion plans to resume off-campus trips throughout the school year.



HEALTH & SAFETY

PERSONAL HYGIENE

Students will be reminded both verbally and by signage to use sanitizer upon entering each classroom and to wash hands frequently.

INCREASED CLEANING & DISINFECTING

- All staff and students who will be completing any janitorial services will have a thorough training in procedures and equipment use.
- Teachers and staff will use a health department approved disinfectant to disinfect all chairs, desks, doorknobs, and any other potentially infected surface between each class or use.
- All classrooms and any other room used in the administration building or Hankins Hall will have a general disinfection at the end of each day using a spray method with an approved disinfectant.
- All high traffic public areas (e.g. door crash bars, drinking fountains, railings, countertops, etc.) will be disinfected at a minimum two times per day.
- When cleaning bathrooms or other areas that require more than a disinfecting, the area will be sprayed with AQ disinfectant before cleaning. Sanitizing using the AQ product requires the surface or object to be sprayed and allowed to dry.

IF A STUDENT IS SICK

Any student who exhibits a temperature (greater than 100.4) and/or other COVID-19 symptom (shortness of breath, coughing, muscle aches, fatigue, etc) must leave campus within 24 hours (not via public transportation). When available, Campion Academy will provide a separate room and transportation for COVID testing for students who live more than 100 miles from campus. All students who test positive **MUST** have a local host family who will pick the student up within 24 hours.



A STUDENT MAY ATTEND CLASSES IF THEY FULFILL THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

- Can actively participate in class without the use of fever/symptom reducing medicine (Tylenol, ibuprofen, cough syrup, etc.)
- Has a temperature below 100.4
- Has no symptoms of COVID-19 such as respiratory symptoms, muscle aches, loss of taste and smell, with or without fever.



A STUDENT WILL BE PUT ON SICK LIST (VILLAGE STUDENTS STAY HOME) AND PUT IN ISOLATION IF THEY HAVE ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Feeling unwell and any signs or symptoms of a communicable disease
- A temperature greater than 100.4 and/or any other COVID-19 symptoms
- They have had close contact with someone who has COVID-19 (or symptoms) as defined by the CDC: Individual who has had close contact (less than six feet) for more than 15 minutes. Fully vaccinated individuals do not have to quarantine unless exhibiting symptoms.
- Students on sick list with mild symptoms will be asked to attend classes via Zoom to maintain their academics.
- If students live within 100 miles of the school, they are required to go home to isolate.
- Close contacts (see below for definition) will be identified and immediately placed in isolation.
- If a student, who has previously had COVID, is identified as a close contact (see below for definition) and they are 90 days from the previous COVID infection, they will be placed in isolation.



RETURN TO SCHOOL AFTER ILLNESS RELATED TO COVID-19

While we know that there are many published guidelines regarding COVID and this can be very confusing, we abide by the guidelines Larimer county has set out for Campion Academy. These guidelines are slightly different from what public/day schools abide by and what the CDC has recently published due to the fact that we are a boarding school which places us in a high-risk category.

- Symptomatic students are tested with a rapid antigen test within about 24 hours based upon availability of the school nurse.
 - If the COVID test is negative, the student remains on sicklist, in a sick room until their symptoms have resolved or had significant improvement, if symptoms do not resolve within a couple of days they may be tested again for COVID.
 - If the COVID test is positive, the student must isolate for 10 days and can return to school on day 11 without the need to test, as long as they are symptom free or have symptoms that are resolving without the use of any medications.
- Students on isolation due to being a close contact (see below for definition) must isolate for 10 days (returning on day 11) without the need to test. Close contacts are able to receive a rapid PCR test on day 7 and if it is negative they may return on day 8. (Free rapid PCR tests are available at Walgreens and are called Rapid ID Now. They open up scheduling one week ahead of time and fill quickly so scheduling quickly is essential to be able to truncate the students isolation period).



DEFINITIONS

- A fully vaccinated individual means they are within 6 months of their second vaccination if Moderna or Pfizer, or within 2 months if Johnson and Johnson, or they have received their booster vaccination if they are outside of these time parameters.
- Close contacts are identified as individuals who have been together for at least 15 minutes over the past 24 hours without the use of masks. If all parties are masked, they are not considered close contacts, unless they are part of a high risk group which includes sports and music.

RESIDENCE HALLS

CLOSED TO VISITORS

Only residents and residence hall staff will be allowed in the residence halls. Guest rooms will be closed at this time.

SANITATION

Girls in the residence hall will be responsible for cleaning and disinfecting their own bathrooms. Boys in the residence hall will have assigned bathroom cleaning duties on a rotating schedule as determined by the dean.

All common areas will be cleaned and disinfected at least twice daily.

MASKS & PHYSICAL DISTANCING

Masks are required in all areas of the residence halls outside of personal rooms. If residents have visitors in their rooms, all present should wear masks. Residents are encouraged to practice physical distancing as much as possible.

LEAVING CAMPUS

Students may once again request off-campus leaves through the residence hall deans to family or approved non-family member homes, according to the policies outlined in the student handbook.



PREPARING FOR CHANGING SCENARIOS

Our goal is to keep Campion Academy functioning with in-person classes the entire 2020-2021 school year. In the event that Campion Academy must send students home due to state orders, the teachers and staff are prepared to continue classes via online platforms and will work to get students back on campus as soon as possible.



UPDATES

If there is one thing we've learned through this pandemic, it's to expect the unexpected. Campion Academy's administration will continue to monitor current health guidance and is prepared to change COVID policies during the school year as the situation changes. Any changes, whether less or more restrictive, will be communicated as quickly as possible to families.
